The Chairman opened the meeting with the following words: "Since its previous meeting the Association has had to deplore the death of its secretary during a long stretch of years, Dr. TORSTEN KROKSTRÖM, professor at Farouk I University in Alexandria.

T. Krokström was born in 1905 and after passing his matriculation examination in Gävle in 1923 proceeded to Uppsala, where he studied geology as his chief subject. He graduated in 1936 and in the same year was appointed lecturer at Upsala University. 1943—1945 he was in charge of the Dept. of Geology, and in 1946 accepted an invitation to the chair of geology at the University in Alexandria.

Prof. Krokström's main interest centered round the petrology of the basic rocks, but he also devoted considerable time to the problems of granitization, particularly during his last years in Upsala.

Prof. Krokström was a teacher of remarkable ability. His lectures always were models of lucidity, stringency, and formal perfection, and in a rare measure apt to interest and inspire his audience.

It was with consternation and deep regret that the news of his sudden death was received. We have lost with him a great student, a fascinating teacher, and a true friend.

At the time of his death the results of his Asiatic researches were largely ready in manuscript. He was widely known abroad and his personal contacts have gained the Swedish school of Quaternary geology international recognition. N. HÖRNER was always among the most frequent attendants of our meetings. We deplore in him the inspiring teacher, the eminent student, and the true friend.

The Chairman gave the Meeting the following information: "This summer geological science has lost two devoted adepts, one an old man, who had been attached to this Dept. for nearly 50 years, the other quite young.

AXEL R. ANDERSSON had been preparator at this Dept. from the early nineties to 1928. His outstanding ability in the preparation of thin sections rendered him gold medals at the world exhibitions of Chicago 1893 and of Paris 1900.

He always was in close touch with the students of geology and his humorous mind and profound knowledge of human nature gained him many friends. He often attended the Association's meetings, even after his retirement. At the time of his death, in the middle of June, AXEL R. ANDERSSON was nearly 94 years of age.

On August 19 NILS-ERIK ROSS, first assistant at the Dept. of Palaeontology, passed away at the early age of 26. We all know his sufferings. He early became fascinated by the problems of Quaternary geology, and it was in pollen analysis that he gave his most important contributions to science. In spite of his youth his name had become known in international circles. He mainly studied pollen from Cretaceous and Tertiary sediments, which had hitherto not received attention in Sweden. He was popular with all he came into contact with and the Association has lost with him a devoted member who had also contributed with several lectures to our meetings. He also had been its secretary during several terms. We shall all remember the modest and cheerful friend.
